Since all we do must be to the glory of God (1 Cor. 10:31), then we must heed the scriptures. (The list below is from a Christian named Brett. I received this via e-mail.)

For they eat the bread of wickedness, and drink the wine of violence," (Prov. 4:17).

"And have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather reprove them. For it is a shame even to speak of those things which are done of them in secret," (Eph. 5:11,12).

"And GOD saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every imagination of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually," (Gen. 6:5).

"For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strong holds; Casting down

imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ," (2 Cor. 10:4,5).
