**THERE IS MORE TO IT THAN WHAT WE NORMALLY SEE**

We have often discussed the story of Nadab and Abihu recorded for us in Lev. 10. These two men, sons of Aaron, offered strange fire to God as they were performing their duties as priests. This event caused God to be quite angry with them and God destroyed them with fire.

As we think about this, we talk about how Nadab and Abihu did that which God commanded them not, and since they did, they deserved to be punished by God. We can then talk about other examples of such disobedience in the Bible. Each incident helps us to understand that we must obey God in all that he says. To disobey will bring

the wrath of God upon us.

And certainly, this is a great lesson that we learn from this story. However, there is more to it than what we normally see. The event recorded in Lev. 10:3, though often overlooked, teaches us another very valuable lesson.

As Aaron is in a position to say something about his sons being killed, Moses stops him. Moses reminds Aaron that the death of Nadab and Abihu is just and that God had taught them something we all must remember.

1. “I will be sanctified”. God is special and will be set apart in the lives of his people.
2. “I will be glorified.” Honor, reverence, and respect belong to God. God will never accept any substitutes and will not accept less than absolute obedience.

Because Nadab and Abihu had looked to themselves and did things their way, they showed that God was not special and that they could make their own rules. They learned the hard way that man cannot direct his own steps (Jer.10:23).

We need to pay attention to the things recorded for us in God’s word and realize that sometimes “There is more to it than what we normally see!” We need to dig deeper and learn the lessons God has taught us, so we can show the proper respect for God in all we do.
