HOW TO DECIDE?

The question has been asked many times as to how one decides whether something is right or wrong. The obvious answer to this is that the Bible teaches us what is right and what is wrong (II Peter 1:3). While such is the case, we sometimes need direction in what we are studying. The purpose of this article is to present several questions we should

ask ourselves when making a decision about something.

1. Would Christ do it? (I Peter 2:21).
2. What effect will this have on my immediate family? (Ephesians 6:4).
3. What effect will this have on others around me? (I Timothy 4:12).
4. Will it cause others to sin? (Romans 14:15).
5. Will it be that for which I can give a good account of in the day of Judgment? (Romans 14:12).
6. Does it give the appearance of evil? (I Thessalonians 5:22).
7. If others did what I do, will it be beneficial to them? (I Timothy 4:16).
8. Does it exemplify pure religion? (James 1:27).
9. Will it cause me to lean more closely to sin? (I Peter 2:11).
10. Will it bring glory to God? (Matthew 5:16; I Corinthians 10:31).
11. Is it something that I could recommend to all? (II Timothy 2:2; Romans 2:21-23).
12. Is it holy? (I Peter 1:16).

There are, I am sure, other questions that we could ask, but these will suffice to put us in the right direction in our decision making. Remember, we are Christians all the time, and all the decisions we make should be those which cause others to see Christ living in us.
